be available on the website on April 15th.


UPCOMING TRAINING

FOCUSED FEATURE: ADVANCED SEARCH AND STUDENT LISTS

Our first Focused Feature training will focus on the advanced search feature in Navigate. This is a widely used tool, but there are likely a number of filters and subsequent actions you can take from the search that may be less well-known. This training is recommended for ALL users to get a better understanding of the filters in the advanced search area, saving lists and searches, uploading lists, scheduled reports, and other ways you can better identify students and provide outreach.
